I didn't have time to review all of it, but here are a few limited comments:

Pg. 13 second line after Recreation. I'd take out the word "on" after "enjoy".

Pg. 165 fourth bullet under CONSIDERATION - NFPTs not NFTPs.

Pg 167 opposite "food" I'd add Red Maple. These flowers are about the first available in the spring and the bees really go after them.

Pg 171 last bullet above CROSS REFERENCE maybe add "non-maple species also serve as good anchors for tubing main lines." (Could also go in the paragraph above on attaching tubing systems.)

Overall, I thought the maple section looked great. Incidentally, I noticed you reference the latest version of the North American Maple Syrup Producers Manual so one of you must have a copy.
